**Police Cadets** will be compensated for their work with the department at a wage of \$9.00 hour.

**Police Cadets** will receive training on observation, communicating police procedures, policies, and techniques on patrolling, radio procedures, ethics, and customer service. This training is a part of the program.

## Requirements

In order to participate in the Cadet Program, students must pass/meet the following requirements:

- Between the ages of 16-19 years of age by start of the program
- Police Record Check
- Background Investigation
- Drug Test
- Attend a school in Ohio or have graduated from an Ohio school less than six months ago

Students will need:

- Valid State or School ID with picture
- Social Security card or letter
- Parent or Guardian permission/signature if under age 18.

**Cincinnati Police Summer Cadet Program**



**Developing Tomorrows

The Cincinnati Police Summer Cadet Program gives students ages 16 through 19 the opportunity to work part time, during the summer, for the Cincinnati Police Department.



The Cadet Program represents a major initiative to provide students with the chance to learn about police work. Along with this, the Cadet Program gives students the opportunity to stand up against crime in their city, which helps to provide a sense of pride in their neighborhood.

The program will provide resources and opportunities to qualified persons interested in choosing police work as a career. This will be done through:

- Training on Policing Techniques
- Police Procedures
- Planned observation with Police Mentors
- Hands-on job specific training

The selection process begins with filling out an application. This application will require information on grades, references, volunteer service, and a brief explanation as to why the student is interested in participating in the Cadet Program.

A selection committee will be appointed by the Cincinnati Police Chief. All applicants who meet the above requirements will be screened by the selection committee.



The selection committee will then make suggestions as to whom they believe should be accepted into the program. The final selections will be made by the Chief, based on recommendations from the selection committee.

The Cadet Program operates Tuesday through Saturday, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. In total, Cadets will work 30 hours per week.



Cadets will spend all of their week assigned to a Police Officer conducting a variety of duties. These duties may include patrolling the city or attending community events within the city.

Cadets will spend some of their days participating in classes conducted by School Resource Officers. These classes include physical training, defensive tactics, and policing techniques.
