- 15 GMI homicides occurred between Jan 1 and May 31 of this year
- GMI homicides up 25.0% compared to the same timeframe in 2012
- Shootings up 11.0% compared to the same timeframe in 2012
- Highest number of shootings since the inception of CIRV


Highlights

- Commitment from new Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil to be a formal and active member of the CIRV Law Enforcement Team
- Reengaged Hamilton County Probation in CIRV
- 138 inmates with violent histories returning from Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction in the next 90 days provided with information on CIRV services

Law Enforcement Team

- CIRV group/gang member list and territories updated
- Ongoing CIRV enforcement efforts in E. Price Hill, Roselawn, and Evanston
- List of CIRV group/gang members on active Ohio Adult Parole Authority supervision updated and provided to all CIRV Law Enforcement Team partners

Services Team

- Reentry Outreach Coordinator and Program Specialist positions filled
- One Stop Resource Center has opened at 138 E. Court St, Rm 101 to provide resources, information, and connections to services that reduce the possibility of being an offender or victim of crime
- Coordinated 3 outreach events with the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, which attracted over 400 inmates

Community Engagement Team

- Identified additional targets in Avondale and began contacting influencers
- Met with East Price Hill Improvement Association and obtained their support for moving forward with Moral Voice in their community
- Formed the East Price Hill Strategic Planning team to develop a strategy for implementing Moral Voice

Systems Team

- Monthly scorecards created to regularly assess teams' progress
- Completed annual Home Visits report
- An evaluation of CIRV found that both GMI homicides and firearm related offenses decreased in Cincinnati after CIRV was implemented within the city. The table below depicts the average number of monthly shootings before, during, and after CIRV's implementation
