- 32 GMI homicides occurred between Jan 1 and Sept 30 of this year
- GMI homicides up 39.1% compared to the same timeframe in 2012, but equal to the number of GMI homicides for the same time frame in 2011
- Shootings up 14.5% compared to the same timeframe in 2012
- Highest number of shootings since the inception of CIRV



Law Enforcement Team

- Two city-wide call-ins were held on September 19th, with 62 invitees in attendance
- Cincinnati Adult Parole Authority assisted with both call-ins, and the Home Visits leading up to the call-ins

Services Team

- Between June and August, the Hamilton County Office of Re-entry conducted 86 intakes
- 17 of these were identified as high risk CIRV clients
- Outreach was provided to 846 individuals via the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction
- 125 service referrals were made

Community Engagement Team

- Reviewed and recommended changes to the Protocol for Community Engagement for Moral Voice to facilitate the exchange of information between the community and police department
- Met with OTR Community Leaders and obtained their support for moving forward with the Moral Voice in their community
- Implemented the Moral Voice Strategy in East Price Hill
- A special thank you to the 4 community members who assisted with the implementation of Moral Voice - making 44 calls and successfully holding 12 conversations with influentials to spread the CIRV message of non-violence

Systems Team

- Monthly scorecards created to regularly assess teams' progress
- An evaluation of CIRV found that both GMI homicides and firearm related offenses decreased in Cincinnati after CIRV was implemented within the city. The table below depicts the average number of monthly shootings before, during, and after CIRV's implementation
