

NEWPORT TO USE STATION X RADIO

“Unfortunate Misunderstanding,” Says Wallingford of Police Squabble

Newport does not want to stop using the police radio service given by Station X in Cincinnati, according to Clyde E. Wallingford, Newport city manager.

City Manager Dykstra announced Wednesday that if neighboring communities such as Newport did not wish to heed the calls of Station X they did not have to do so. He advised, however, official notification of such action in order that citizens might be warned accordingly.

Mr. Dykstra's statement followed reports of resentment on the part of certain Newport police officers because the victim of a holdup at 130 E. Ninth-st, Newport, late Tuesday, reported the occurrence first to Station X.

“I do not wish any controversy with Mr. Dykstra,” Mr. Wallingford said Thursday. “Newport is part of the Cincinnati regional police system and has received invaluable aid from Station X. I would not think of doing without the services of the police radio.

“Certainly Newport police have co-operated with the officers of Cincinnati and neighboring communities. I have talked things over with Cincinnati officials and it is agreed the entire matter was an unfortunate misunderstanding.”
