Driver Tunes in Police Radio Calls, Fined \$5 Ordinance Invoked For First Time

Next July will mark the 10th anniversary of the installation of radio equipment at Police Station X. And since that time a city_ordinance_prohibiting_private citizens from receiving radio police calls has been in effect.

Nelson Riley, 18; of Two Mile road, appeared before Judge William D. Alexander in the Police Court Thursday, charged with being the first violator of the ordinance since it was passed.

He was arrested Wednesday night by Patrolmen Albert White and Raymond Handley, who said he was listening to police calls on the radio in his auto. He was fined \$5 and costs. He said he did not know he was breaking a law.
