

City Offers Police Calls at 20 Cents

Covington to Build Own Radio Station

Cincinnati will be "glad" to transmit messages over Station X, the police radio, for 34 municipalities and subdivisions in Greater Cincinnati—at 20 cents a message. City Manager Sherrill informed officials of the subdivisions Wednesday.

He pointed out that City Council authorized the fee in an ordinance passed Sept. 3 and which becomes effective Oct. 3.

Since action was taken to charge for the broadcasts, three municipalities, Norwood, Wyoming and Covington, Ky., have taken steps to install two-way radio communication for their police departments. Norwood and Wyoming expect to have their radio systems operating within a few months. Definite announcement that Covington will have its own police broadcasting system was made Wednesday by City Manager Jack Maynard.
