

New Police Radio Set Up In Kentucky

The new Campbell county (Ky.) police two-way radio system went on the air for the first time Thursday.

Installed at a cost of about \$8000, center of the system is at Alexandria, where a dispatcher will be available around the clock.

Two-way radios have been placed in all county cruisers and in the offices of the county road engineer, road foreman and road trouble-shooter.

Chief Harry Stuart also announced establishment of a 10-man auxiliary police force to aid the county patrol system for its calls, paying \$2100 per year. Other cities in the county use either the Newport system or Station X in Cincinnati.
