

'Copter Cop To Spot Jams As They Form

World Series traffic to and from Crosley Field will be controlled, to a large extent, from the air.

Lt. Arthur Mehring, the Copter Cop, will fly around the field and perimeter streets for an hour before and after each game.

If Lt. Mehring sees a traffic tieup he will radio instructions to the police radio station.

Station X will relay the instructions to cruisers or foot patrolmen in the area.

A dozen or more policemen doing traffic duty on foot will

have transistor radios to receive orders. Lt. Mehring also will make his usual broadcasts over WLW radio.

LT. COL. GUY YORK, assistant chief, also will have a command post setup in the triangle at the field off Western avenue. He will direct operations from there.

Some bus drivers also will be equipped with transistor radios, Lt. Mehring said. If traffic is jammed in front of them, Lt. Mehring will relay a route for them to follow.

In the immediate vicinity of the park, loaded buses will be permitted to leave their

regular routes to avoid heavy traffic.

CINCINNATI POLICE suggest that motorists en route to Crosley Field on Central parkway stay on the parkway until they reach either Findlay, or Liberty streets before turning off.

Lt. Mehring said police will keep traffic moving rapidly on Liberty and Findlay streets.

The one-way street pattern to and from the park will be put into effect for each game. Changes on some of the main streets include:

BEFORE GAME — Findlay street one way west from

Central parkway to Dalton avenue; Liberty street one way west from Central parkway to Freeman avenue, and Liberty street one way east from Dalton to Western avenue.

AFTER GAME — Findlay street one way east from Western avenue to Central parkway; Liberty street east from Dalton avenue to Central parkway; Dalton avenue one way south from Sherman avenue to Gest street, and Harriet street, one way south from Gest to Seventh street.

Motorists also will be allowed to make a left turn onto Central parkway from Liberty street.
