

# Electric Police Timer Proposed

Robert Lockridge, Cincinnati safety director, wants council to buy an electrical timing device which would keep track of policemen when they go off the air to make an investigation.

Lockridge says the timer, to be installed at Station X, would cost around \$11,000. He says it would relieve five police cadets of keeping a record of policemen when they call and say they are leaving their cruisers to make an investigation.

Lockridge says the new timer can be set for the time the policeman says he will be away. After the time elapses, if the policeman has not called in, the timer flashes a red warning signal at Station X.
